



Baseball For All Comes to Maryland

In little league baseball there are around 100,000 girls playing nationwide, by highschool, 99% of these girls will have dropped the sport. Why does this happen? Who, if anyone, is behind it? How can we change this pattern? These are all valuable questions, and Justine Siegal has devoted her career to finding the answers and taking action. Justine is an American baseball coach who is working to create equal treatment and opportunity for girls on and off the field. Justine is an innovator. In 2009, she became the first woman to coach a major league baseball team. In 2011, she became the first woman to throw batting practice to a professional baseball team. Most importantly, she founded the organization Baseball For All in 2016. This organization states that their mission is "Leveling the playing field for girls across America by addressing the social justice issue of gender inequality."

In just the few years that Baseball For All has been around, they have already had a huge impact. Starting with just one all-girl team, they quickly expanded. Today, they have players from 37 different states competing in tournaments all across the country and further. But their impact is even greater than that. The organization has taught girls lessons that can be applied throughout life; one Baseball For All player said that, "Justine [has] made me see that with enough hard work and dedication you can accomplish anything."

Justine and her work has shown us the urgency of this issue and has demonstrated that it is possible to make a change. Should Roland Park consider an all-girls team? That is for you to decide.


